CTC just days away!

From David & Marilyn Dedeaux, MCMC Auto Advisory Members to Cruisin' The Coast

Cruisin' The Coast (CTC) 2011 is in full swing. There are over 4,200 cars pre-registered, supplies have been ordered and details are getting settled. To help you in planning your volunteer experience, the following is provided for your use and information.

CTC Policies

1. MCMC members that sign-up as Cruisin' The Coast volunteers on or before July 12, 2011, and work 8 hours will receive a staff T-shirt.
2. MCMC volunteers that work 24 hours in 2011 will qualify for a free (comp) registration for CTC 2012.
3. MCMC club members with cars newer than 1986, and this is their first year to volunteer for CTC, must work 8 hours to be eligible for a "Host Club Card." This will allow host car club members with late model cars into stamping sites NEXT year.
4. Cruisin' stamping sites are open Thursday, Oct. 6 through Saturday, Oct. 8 during Cruisin' week. Only eligible cars will be allowed in stamping sites. Eligible cars are those registered vehicles 1986 and older, grandfathered "modified" late model vehicles and Host Car Club Member late model vehicles.



CTC work schedule for MCMC members includes the following:

Saturday, Sept. 24 – CTC "Packing Party" Coca-Cola plant meeting room beginning at 8:30 a.m. – until 5,000 registration packets are assembled.

Wednesday, Sept. 28, 9 a.m. – MCMC members meet at Cruise Central (Centennial Plaza also known as the old Gulfport VA) to survey area, police the grounds and mark-off.

Thursday, Sept. 29, 9 a.m. – Pick up rental van. 9:30 a.m., Meet at AAA Storage located on Eisenhower, north or railroad tracks in Biloxi to load supplies.

Friday, Sept. 30, 9 a.m. – Continue set up of Cruise Central parking.

Saturday, Oct. 1, 9 a.m. – Continue set up of Cruise Central parking.

Sunday, Oct. 2, 8 a.m. – Hardy Court shopping center, Courthouse Rd., Gulfport, assist with parking for CTC Cruise-in.
